

# 10 TERMINAL PROJECT

The **Headland Preservation Group inc.** has generated concepts for how the **10 Terminal complex** might best be adaptively re-used for the benefit of the wider community. These concepts are consistent with the statutory charter and the plans of the Sydney Harbour Federation Trust. They would help achieve the vision with which the Trust was established over 15 years ago - in particular, to **“protect, conserve and interpret the environmental and heritage values of Trust land”**.

These concepts are set out in the **10 TERMINAL Project**, a plan prepared by HPG, at the invitation of Federal Environment Minister Greg Hunt, for a heritage interpretive centre in the 10 Terminal complex and its surrounds.

**The proposed 10 TERMINAL Project envisages a walk-through multi-function site, which would:**

- Provide a range of spaces and facilities for school visits, with opportunities for indoor/outdoor learning about military and indigenous heritage, ecology and marine life.
- Promote reconciliation by cultivating greater understanding of indigenous culture through displays, activities and programs that will educate and inspire.
- Provide a rotating gallery for indigenous and local artists on the extensive wall space in the 10 Terminal buildings.
- Provide an accessible and convenient destination for tourists seeking to see an indigenous centre in conjunction with seeing Australian animals at nearby Taronga Zoo.
- Provide a tangible demonstration of appropriate adaptive re-use of heritage-listed buildings.
- Lease cafes and shops catering for visitors to 10 TERMINAL.
- Lease space to the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service for an information centre
- Offer some serviced and un-serviced office accommodation utilising existing offices whose size and layout suit “small office/home office” applications.
